Autumn Liturgy Seminar

It's that time of year again. Parish groups and committees are starting up after the summer break. Our Autumn Liturgy Seminar will take place on Saturday 1 October in Clonliffe College. Once again we offer a range of workshops on various topics which we hope will be of interest to you in your ministry to your parish community. Come and meet others involved in liturgy throughout the diocese and attend two workshops of your choice from the five on offer. Registration is at 9.00 a.m. and sessions begin at 9.30 a.m. There is a 20 minute break at 11.00 a.m. and the next session will continue until 12.50 p.m. At that time we move to the church for a Prayer Service which will incorporate elements from all the workshops. Booking is essential ($\in 10$ per person) and forms are included with this newsletter or are available in the download section of our website.

1. RCIA: experiencing the first few steps.

Damian McNeice will present a workshop which models the Rite of Acceptance and celebrations of the Word

proper to the period of the Catechumenate. This will be of assistance to members of RCIA teams, especially those who are new to accompanying those seeking Christian Initiation, These are the first rituals in the "gradual process" of the Christian Initiation of Adults "that takes place within the community of the faithful" [RCIA #4]. Some copies of the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* for use in Ireland will be on sale on the day for \in 25. Free handouts are also provided.

2. Confirmation: What Are We At? One Parish Response

The Celbridge Confirmation Team will share their journey of exploration leading to a new way of preparing for Confirmation in the churches of Straffan and Celbridge. The central elements of the vision that guided their steps include:

- Developing the pathway to Confirmation into a two year journey, beginning in 5th class.
- All branches of the parish family (Home, Parish, School) working in tandem.
- Motivating parishioners, parents, sponsors, and candidates to become involved much more proactively than previously.

The initiative is not being presented as a template, but as one rewarding response to the challenge and the opportunity to evangelise the imagination. Come and see.

3. The Liturgical Year

Pat O'Donoghue will consider how the Liturgical Year can be respected while at the same time marking other church jubilees and special events in the calendar of the wider community.

The cycle of the Liturgical Year which was formulated by Christian communities over many centuries has its own integrity. The Calendar Year has its own special occasions and events. In recent times we have been encouraged to celebrate Mission Sunday, Restorative Justice Week and Catholic Schools Week to name a few.

In addition we have had universal themes such as the Jubilee of Mercy and The Year of Faith. How do we celebrate all of these together while respecting the celebration of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus in the cyclical way of our tradition?




4. Singing the Mystery of Faith

Columba McCann will bring to life in his workshop the most recent publication of the National Centre for Liturgy – *Singing the Mystery of Faith - A Guide to Liturgical Music.*

'The discussions of the Advisory Committee on Church Music (of which he is the current

chairperson) played an important part in the origins and development of this guidebook. These guidelines will take the reader step by step through each liturgy and will be very useful to musicians who know their musical craft. seek clearer but а




understanding of liturgical needs. They will also facilitate a more long-term pastoral strategy regarding music in the liturgy by examining relevant roles and ministries and thus will be of use.' (*National Centre for Liturgy*) The Publication is available from Veritas and will be on sale on the day ($\in 10$).

5. Emmanuel 2017

Ian Callanan will introduce music from the Emmanuel 2017 programme pointing out where these can be used in celebrations of the Eucharist and other services.

Emmanuel is our music programme for second level schools and is going from strength to strength with over 60 schools from around the Diocese involved. Half of the 2017 programme is devoted to music for the liturgical year and offers new suggestions such as *Jesus*, *All for Jesus* (Robin Mark) and *King of Kings* (Jarod Cooper). The Irish tradition is maintained with music by Irish composers including the Advent refrain -

Ullmhaígí Bóthar an Tiarna by Máire Ní Dhuibhir. If you think this music is simply for teenagers you will be surprised to learn that Emmanuel Music is widely sung by more mature choirs and groups. The 2017 Music Book and CD will be on sale on the day.



World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

Laudato Si – *On care for our common home* – the encyclical letter of Pope Francis launched last year, continues to offer food for thought and action. Archbishop Diarmuid Martin will lead an ecumenical celebration inspired by this document on **Thursday 1 September** at **7.30 p.m.** in Clonliffe College Church to mark World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. All are welcome.

The Gospel of the following Sunday, 4 September, includes this phrase, 'none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions' (Luke 14:33). This could be linked to a quotation from Pope Francis' document: 'Patriarch Bartolomeo asks us to replace consumption with



sacrifice, greed with generosity, wastefulness with a spirit of sharing, an asceticism which "entails learning to give, and not simply to give up. It is a way of loving, of moving gradually away from what I want to what God's world needs. It is liberation from fear, greed and compulsion". (Laudato Si 17)

End Poverty Service

International Day for the Eradication of Poverty will be marked on Monday 17 October with a prayer service at 8.00 p.m. in the Monastery of St. Alphonsus, St. Alphonsus Road, Drumcondra. Through reflections and readings prepared by the Part-Time Chaplaincy Students of DCU and the music of the Dublin Diocesan Music Group those who gather will take time to face the challenge of this issue which is both global and local. We will also celebrate the values of the kingdom of simplicity

proclaimed by Jesus, the friend of the poor. The eradication of poverty International Day for the Eradication of Poverty has been observed since 1993. when the UN General Assembly chose this day to promote awareness of the need to eradicate global

poverty. Pope Francis has underlined the importance of the day, most notably its aim to encourage the international community "eliminate extreme poverty and discrimination", and to ensure that all global citizens are able to "fully exercise their fundamental rights".

Diocesan Advent Service

This year's Advent Service is being hosted in the recently refurbished Church of the Good Shepherd, Churchtown on Saturday 26 November at 4.00 p.m. The liturgy will be prepared by the Full-Time Chaplaincy Students of DCU and the liturgical music will be led by the Dublin Diocesan Music Group.

This Advent the readings are from Cycle A with many inspirational phrases in the First Readings from the Prophet Isaiah:

- "there will be no more training for war" (Is.2:5)
- "the cow and bear make friends, their young lie down together" (Is.11:7)
- "Courage! Do not be afraid" (Is.35:4)
- "the maiden is with child... whom she will call Immanuel, a name which means 'God is-with-us'" (Is.7:14)

The Advent Service will incorporate these phrases into a prayerful movement for peace in the world.

It is interesting that we use the abbreviation Is. for the Prophet Isaiah and the world is focused at the same time on the movement called IS -Islamic State. Come and pray for peace this Advent.
