Come back to me with all your heart (Hosea 14:1)



A Thought 'Jesus in the confessional is not a dry cleaner. Confession is an encounter with Jesus, with this Jesus who waits for us, who waits for us just as we are.' (Pope Francis)

You might consider starting the journey of reconciliation by approaching one person who you have offended recently or in the past and with whom you want to make up. If that is not possible, for whatever reason, you might write a letter of apology even if you never send it.



Daily Prayer O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you...

My offences truly I know them (Psalm 50:3)



A Thought 'Concreteness, honesty, and the genuíne abílíty to be ashamed of one's místakes are all qualities needed in order to be open to the forgiveness of God, as well as the deep awareness of his love.' (Pope Francís)

The Good Thief who died on the cross beside Jesus teaches us about healing our hearts. He looks into himself, sees his failings, and then asks Jesus to simply remember him. Take time each day to place your hand on

your heart and to remember your own

weaknesses and failings. Finish this task with the daily prayer with hand on heart.



Daily Prayer Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom

'Stand up,' he said, 'do not be afraid' (Matthew 17:8)



A Thought 'And we must never tire of going to ask for forgiveness. You may feel ashamed to tell your sins, but as our mothers and our

grandmothers used to say, it is better to be red once than yellow a thousand times. We blush once but then our sins are forgiven and we go forward.' (Pope Francis)

Bring to your mind something that you have never confessed to anyone. Take courage and confide in a trusted friend. You might be surprised that a moment of embarrassment could lead to a lifetime of peace.



Daily Prayer Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you

Come and see a man who has told me everything I ever did (John 4:29)



A Thought 'I want to remind priests that the confessional must not be a torture chamber but rather an encounter with the Lord's mercy which spurs us on to do our best. Everyone needs to be touched by the comfort and attraction of God's saving love, which is mysteriously at work ín each person, above and beyond their faults and failings." (Pope Francís)

Create a timeline of forgiveness by compiling a list of occasions when you showed forgiveness to others, when you refused forgiveness to others and the times when you experienced forgiveness.
