Holy Cross College (also known as **Clonliffe College**), located at the junction of Clonliffe Road & Jones Road, Drumcondra was opened 1 September 1859 as the Catholic Diocesan Seminary for Dublin by Cardinal Paul Cullen (1803–78).

The College is adjacent to the residence of the Archbishop of Dublin, just north of Croke Park Stadium.

The Mater Dei Institute of Education is also on the same campus.

A number of Dublin Diocesan bodies such as Crosscare are based there in addition to many of the Curial staff of the Diocese.
