Reflection Richard Rohr

The many "multiplication" of food stories in the Gospels—when Jesus feeds a crowd with very little clearly exemplify abundance as the foundation of reality. Notice in almost every case that the good apostles, who represent our worldview of scarcity, advise Jesus against feeding the crowd: "But how will two fish and five loaves be enough for so many?" Jesus is trying to move them from their worldview of scarcity to one of abundance, but does so with great difficulty. In the end, there is always much food left over.
